

Mawarra Public School Discipline System (Revised for 2015)

Level	Examples of student behaviour	Consequences and Level expectations
<u>Green</u> <u>Level 0</u> Responsibility of the class teacher.	The child is co-operative and obeys all school rules.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The child is involved in all school activities, will be able to participate in Club Zero and is receiving awards which will accumulate towards further recognition.
<u>Orange</u> <u>Warning Level</u> Responsibility of the class teacher & supervisor. This is a verbal or written warning level - there is no detention.	The child has broken a school rule. (verbal warning and a written notification slip will be given)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> This level is a warning to the child. The child will discuss the incident with their parents. No privileges are removed and the child is still able to attend Club Zero, at the end of the term, provided no other notification slips are received during the term. The teacher involved will counsel the child, using the appropriate Mawarra Movers language. A verbal warning will be given to the child. A notification slip will be filled in with child's full name and class and sent to the class teacher who will record the incident on the Sentral Welfare site. (This will be acknowledged on the notification slip). The stage supervisor will be informed. The notification will be held by the class teacher and passed on to the supervisor if the child receives a second slip.
<u>Red</u> <u>Level 2</u> Responsibility of the Supervisor in consultation with the teacher. There is a detention penalty and a letter sent home to parents.	The child gets a second written notification slip within a fortnight. <p style="text-align: center;">OR</p> The child is involved in an offence deemed very serious .	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The child is referred to the Stage Supervisor who will counsel the child and will place them on Level 2.. The Supervisor records the incident on the Sentral Welfare site. When the child is placed on detention by the Supervisor: For a first offence the child will be placed on 1 - 3 days detention. For subsequent offences the child will be placed on 2 - 5 days detention. (at the discretion of the supervisor). On the first day of detention the child will fill out a Thinking Sheet - reflecting on the event and impact on those involved. Subsequent days will be spent reflecting on the impact of the incident in line with our Mawarra Movers Positive Behaviour Principles. This will be followed by behaviour monitoring, for the same number of days as the detention period, in a restricted playground area. Parents are informed of the offence and consequences by letter (length of detention and monitoring days). The child will not participate in Excursions or Gala Days while they are on detention or Level 2 monitoring days. Merit awards will be held for the child until they return to Level 0 Once a child has finished detention they will do the same number of monitoring days as the detention. Monitoring days will be marked on a card and an acknowledgement card will be given to the child when they return to Level 0. Class teacher or supervisor may refer the child to the Student Welfare Committee.

<p><u>Exclusion Level</u> <u>Level 3</u></p> <p>The responsibility of the Supervisor in consultation with the Principal. There is a detention penalty and a letter sent home to parents.</p>	<p>The child gets a third notification slip within a fortnight (with discretion).</p> <p style="text-align: center;">OR</p> <p>The child is involved in an event that is deemed extremely serious.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The child is referred to the Stage Supervisor who will place the child on Level 3. The Supervisor will record the incident on the Sentral Welfare site. • The child will be excluded from the playground at recess and the whole of lunch for 5 days and will then be monitored for 5 days of acceptable behaviour, in a restricted playground area, before returning to Level 0. • The child will complete reflection sheets in line with our Mawarra Movers Positive Behaviour Principles. • Parents will be informed of the offence and consequence by letter and a meeting may be sought. • The child will be referred to the Student Welfare Committee and if it is the second Level 3 for the year they will be referred to the School Counsellor. • The child <u>will be excluded</u> from excursions, incursions, camps, representative activities. Merit awards will be held for the child until they return to Level 0. • The child's progress will be closely monitored, by the class teacher and Stage Supervisor, this may be through a daily behaviour report if deemed necessary by the Supervisor.
<p><u>Suspension Level</u> <u>Level 4</u></p> <p>The responsibility of the Principal or representative. The child is suspended from school.</p>	<p>The child's behaviour is intolerable.</p> <p>The child has breached the code of behaviour as set out by the Department of School Education.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Suspension in accordance with the Department of Education and Communities' Policy. • The length of suspension is the decision of the Principal in light of the incident or incidences. • The Supervisor or Principal will record the incident on the Sentral Welfare site. • Suspension is a time for reflection by the child and preparation by the school and parents/caregivers to allow for a successful return to school. • Following the suspension the child will be placed on a level that is appropriate for the seriousness of the incident. • Merit awards will be held for the child until they return to Level 0. • This will be recorded in the school's suspension register.
